2025 Dietary Guidelines Advisory Committee: Meeting 2

The U.S. Departments of Health and Human Services (HHS) and Agriculture (USDA) appointed 20 nationally recognized experts in food and nutrition to serve on the [2025 Dietary Guidelines Advisory Committee](#) (Committee). The Committee will meet approximately six times to discuss its evidence review and draft conclusions and make plans for future work. All Committee meetings can be viewed by the public virtually (live and recorded); and at least one meeting will include an opportunity for the public to provide oral comments to the Committee.

Meeting Description:

The 2025 Dietary Guidelines Advisory Committee held its [second meeting](#) on May 10, 2023, from 9:00 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. Eastern Time. The meeting consisted of:

- Presentations by each subcommittee and deliberation by the full Committee regarding the prioritization of scientific questions and protocol development.
- Discussion of plans for future Committee work.
